What is the overall deductible?	\$250 individual/\$500 family <u>network</u> . \$500 individual/\$1,000 family out-of- <u>network</u> .	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?	Network deductible does not apply to office visits, preventive care services, emergency room care, urgent care, outpatient mental health, outpatient substance abuse, rehabilitation services, and prescription drug benefits. Copayments and coinsurance amounts don't count toward the network deductible.	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount.
