Dear Brother & Sisters of Local 354,

Spring has sprung!!! I hope that all have enjoyed the winter season! Although the last quarter was not awful when it comes to the weather, it did take its toll on Manhours for the local. Supply chain continues to be an issue for the contractors, the cost of equipment and materials has leveled off but they have not been reduced to the prices we saw before Covid and the economy has owners thinking twice about spending money on capital improvements or expansion. Many of you have seen this before, we ride high for a few years with plenty of work opportunities and then we hit a low spell when work just isn't as good. We will come out of this dry spell but at this moment, I cannot project when!

In years past just when we thought the future looks bleak, something would pop up to help, just as the case of the project at Nemacolin Woodlands. In January Whitby Plumbing and Heating, Limbach and Lugaila Mechanical were awarded the plumbing and heating contracts for a renovation of 60 rooms at the hotel with Lugaila getting the HVAC and Whitby and Limbach doing the plumbing. Today we currently have 60 members working at the project from both regions.....just the shot in the arm we needed. This project is supposed to last through the summer and if we prove ourselves with our work ethic and our expertise we will have a good shot at getting the work on the next phase of work on renovating 150 guest rooms.

Along with the Nemacolin Project, we have seen work opportunities in the industrial sector with outages at Conemaugh, Seward and Hilltop power plants. We have seen an uptick in calls that are short-term calls and I thank the membership for taking these calls to man our work.

The local contractors have been managing to maintain manhours for the time being but currently there doesn't look like a lot of projects to bid, this too can change at a drop of the hat. Out of town work has been somewhat busy due to the Nuke outages and outage at the refinery.

Currently the only sizeable projects that are on our radar is the Hempfield High School, which should bid early summer, and the DNA Lab in Westmoreland County, which was bid, but the bidders have not been notified.

I wish all the members and their families a happy spring and summer season!

LOCAL NEWS-

It was recently announced that Homer City Power Plant will be decommissioned and plan to be offline by June of this year. Homer City was a staple for LU 354 and all the building trades for decades! Construction of the plant began in the mid-sixties and in 1969 Units 1 and 2 went online, Unit 3 was placed into operation in 1977. Brothers and sisters of Local 354 enjoyed going to Homer City for the spring and fall outages. Early on, these outages provided a great living for our members. Back in the day, the outages could be as long as 16 weeks in the spring, members would take the next few months off, and then hit the fall outage for another 16 weeks. Over the past decade, the outage schedule grew shorter and shorter, and recently a six-week outage was a long one. There is more than one determining factor resulting in the shutting of Homer City, warmer than usual winters, low prices per KW, the rising cost of coal, but the one factor that is most prevalent is the excessive Federal Emission Limits that have been placed on the Plant. The emissions that Homer City was allowed to emit was unachievable even with installing state of the art equipment to reduce emissions. I am hopeful there will be someone who might take the chance to turn this plant into a natural gas burning facility in the future.

LU 354 Organizer Donnie Arena was selected to head up the PA State Pipe Trades as the Lead Organizer for the state. Brother Arena was selected at the end of 2022 and started his new position January 1, 2023. During the first few months of the year, he was busy interviewing and hiring 6 organizers from around the state and Delaware. He will directly oversee the day-to-day operations of these organizers and organize blitzes and continue to organize throughout the state. **Congratulations** to Donnie for his new position!!

On February 18th the local held its annual apprenticeship contest, the winners were Luke Foy-Pipefitter, Jared Ott-Plumber and the welders Scott Reedy and Adam Bales were tied at the end of the event, so it came down to a weld off and in the end Scott Reedy was named the winner. Just before the state competition was held in Scranton in March, Brother Reedy broke his hand so Adam filled the welder spot at the states. The competition was a strenuous event, and I am pleased to announce that Brother Foy won 1st place as the Pipefitter and Brother Ott won 1st place in the Plumbing Competition, the welder again came down to the wire with Brother Bales just missing out on the 1st place prize. I am not 100% positive, but I am pretty sure that LU 354 has never sent two apprentices to the regional competition before, and we were damn close on sending three!!! I am extremely proud of these three guys, and I look forward to the regional competition that will be held in Pittsburgh in June. Good Luck to Jared and Luke, and I hope we will be sending both to the National Competition to Ann Harbor in the fall.

For the past 4 months, I have been telling everyone that the Latrobe School has been waiting for the electrical equipment to be delivered and installed. I am pleased to announce that this work has been completed and Eddie Andolina and Chad Morrison are coordinating the installation of the mechanical training equipment and associated piping, if everything goes to plan, we should be able to have our first class in the next few months. We have started interviewing apprentices and it looks like we have some good candidates in both the Building Trades and the MES. I am eager and anxious to get the service training up and running and I want to thank all the members that have helped with the project and of course Chad and Eddie for the long hours and hard work that they have put into this new training. As always, we will keep you updated as things progress.



In these instances, the retiree will receive 1 free ticket for themselves and 1 free ticket for a guest. All guest tickets (\$29.99) must be purchased through Idlewild.

HEALTH AND WELFARE-

The trustees have been extremely busy over the last few months, everyone knows that with downturn in the market and the rising cost of health care it has been a real challenge to the fund. We continue to look at ways to improve the benefits without spending a lot of money. One major change that the committee has agreed to has been the change in administration. Beacon Administrators formally known as Vacarro Associates has been our third party administrator for the last 10 years. To provide the membership an improved customer service program the trustees have made the decision to bring the administration of the funds in house, in doing so we have retained Nicki Sayles to work directly for the LU 354 Combined Funds as the administrator! Effective June 1st, Nicki will be full time employed by the 354 Funds working solely for our members and will be working form the Union Hall. There was some upfront costs associated with this decision but the value will be seen over the years as cost savings and work on multiple funds as in her current employment tenure. In addition to the benefit of having Nicki work for us, we have purchased a computer program that members will be able to utilize to see the amount in their banks, HRA accounts and will give them the opportunity to download forms without having to call the office. This part of the program will not be made available by June 1st but I am hopeful it will be ready for use by the end of the 3rd quarter. Until June 1 gets here Nicki is still employed by Beacon, we have recently been told there was a phone number change for the Beacon group, the number we have been given does not work! Effective immediately if you have a need to contact Nicki for any reason, please contact the Hall and we will have Nicki reach out to you.

In February, you all should have received information from John Handcock stating that an administrative charge that will be implemented on a quarterly basis to your retirement account. The fund was able to pay this fee for the membership for the six years while the market was strong, due to the downturn in the market the funding mechanism that paid this fee has diminished, hence the need to have the members pay this fee. As many of you will remember with past custodians this fee was always noticed on your statements, when the Trustees switched to Handcock they were able to implement this benefit at no cost to the participants. I am sure you will all agree that it is a small price to pay for the services John Handcock provides.
